

Bringing God to every cop

TIME and again, ranking officials of the Philippine National Police have tried to turn the institution into a "professional, dynamic and highly motivated force," but they always wind up with "very minimal results."

Recently, four junior officers have taken up the challenge, and they are Tying our a different approach-te effect a moral recovery program centered on the spiritratity of every policeman.

'Unless each member experiences a personal change, then the organisation will hardly change at all," one of the young officers said.

Chief Inspectors Cesar Binax, Lyndon Cubes, Ma. O. Aplases and Benigno Durana, established the Christian Officers Reform of the Police Service (Gotps) Movement Foundation, an intendenominational organization, to bring "God into every cop."

"Me are probably the most mafigued sector, but we cannot blame the people because their perception comes from what they bear or read in the media," said Binag, an administrative officer of the Directorate for Comparollership.

This kind of negative perception, Binag soid, has been hammered in the minus of the people that it has dragged down the PNP as an institution.






